THE SEEKELLS OF SOUTHEASTERN NEW ENGLAND

Question:

Who were the parents of William Seekel who married Delena Pittsley at Freetown, Bristol County, Massachusetts, on 29 June 1829?

What do we know about this William Seekell?

- 1. William Seekel and Polly Pittsley, both of Freetown, published their intentions to marry at Freetown on 12 January 1828.¹
- 2. William Seekel and Delena Pittsley, both of Freetown, married there on 29 June 1829.²
- 3. William Sekell was reported in Freetown in the 1840 census. The household consisted of 1 female 30-39, 1 male 20-29, 2 females 5-9, and 2 females 0-4. William was engaged in agriculture.³
- 3. William W. Cekiel was reported in the 1850 Census in Fairhaven, Bristol County, age 40, fisherman, born in Massachusetts, with real estate valued at \$100. With him were:⁴
 - Delenia Cekiel, 46
 - Lucy A. Cekiel, 19
 - Lydia Cekiel, 17
 - Alice H. Cekiel,13
 - Emeline Cekiel, 10
 - Ezekiel Cekiel, 8
 - William W. Cekiel, 4

- 5. I cannot find William or Delina Seekell in the 1860 Census, which reported the following family in Fairhaven:⁶

 - Elijah Pittsley, 77, farmer
 - Rebecca Pittsley, 82
 - Ezekiel Sekill, 18, mariner
 - Wm. W. Sekill, 14
 - Thomas R. Sekill, 11

Lucy Ann was the daughter of William and Delina; Elijah and Rebecca were the parents of Delina.

- 6. The 1865 Massachusetts State Census reported the following household in Fairhaven:⁷
 - Sekell, Delany, 64, widow
 - Sekell, Ezekiel, 24, single, U.S. Navy
 - Sekell, William W., 20 single, U.S. Navy

- Chase, Lucy A. ,33 widow
- Pittsley, Rebecca, 87, widow

These records suggest that William Seekell was living in 1855 and had died by 1865.

- 7. William W. Seekell purchased a lot of land on Sconticut Neck Road, Fairhaven, on 22 November 1855, and sold (perhaps mortgaged) the property on 7 March 1870.8 This presents a problem. If Delany was a widow in the census of 1 May 1865, the William W. Seekell involved in this land transfer must have been the son William W. Seekell, who was only nineteen years old when he acquired the property.
- 7. According to the death record of the younger William Seekell, in 1900, his father, William W., was born in Middleboro, Plymouth County, Massachusetts, and his mother Delany (Pittsley) was born in Freetown. Summary: We have very little information on William W. Seekell. He was probably born in Middleboro about 1809-10. He lived in Freetown where he farmed, and in Fairhaven, where he worked as a fisherman and a laborer. He died some time between 1855 and 1865.

Can we identify any Seekell families in Middleboro about 1810 who could possiby be William's parents?

The census indexes at ancestry.com for 1810 and 1820 do not report anyone with the surname Seekell or Seekins.

Can we identify the parents of William Seekell by tracing all of the Seekell families of Southeastern Massachusetts?

Tracing Seekell ancestry is complicated by the variety of spellings of the name, which can be summarized as follows:

Initial consonant sound usually *S*, rarely *Sc*, *C* or *Z*First vowel sound ee, e, i, or ea. Some indexes have u, which I believe to be a misreading of ee

Middle consonant sound k, kk, or ck Second vowel sound e, i, ie or a

Final consonant sound *II, I, ns, ngs,* rarely *ms*

The names *Seekell* and *Seekins* are often treated by genealogists as two distinct names. However, the cases where the same person is called *Seekell* and *Seekins* in different records are too numerous to discount. The earliest records use *Seekins*, and a branch of the family that moved to Maine¹⁰ uses *Seekins*, but *Seekell* is the form of the name that became standard in southeastern Massachusetts.

This family should not be confused with the *Van Sickle* family (sometimes the *Van* is dropped) of Dutch origin, or with the *Segall/Seagall* family of Ashkenazi origin. Nor should it be confused with the family of George David Seckel, of German origin, who arrived in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, in 1739.¹¹ There could be a connection to the American Indian family of southeastern Massachusetts, with the surname *Sachamus, Sochenus* or with other variant spellings. I have not been able to make a connection.

The earliest reference to a *Seekins* in southeastern Massachusetts is in a history of Middleboro, written in 1794:¹²

Ketehiquut (or Titicut) mentioned as a place of praying Indians, is in this precinct. A baptist church was formed among them; and Nehemiah, Abel, Thomas Sekins, Thomas Felix, and John Symonds, are mentioned as teachers among them. When I came into this place in 1747, John Symonds was minister of

The Titicut Church (which was Congregational, not Baptist) was organized in 1674, but may have been a place of worship before it was organized. So this article places Thomas Seekins at Titicut some time between 1674 and 1747. It is not clear if Thomas was Indian or English. I find no other reference to this Thomas Seekins.

The next records we find are three marriage records:

Moses Sekel is of record in Bristol County Court in March 1737/8 when Job Caswell sued Moses Sekel of Taunton for failing to deliver 3500 shingles to him at Newport (Newport County, Rhode Island).¹⁶

Aaron Seekins is of record when he purchased land in Middleboro on 31 July 1724, sold half of this land on 17 August 1725, and sold more of

this property on 25 April 1737.¹⁷

The next information on this family is a series of marriage records for persons who *could be* children of Moses or Aaron:

In addition, there was a Moses Sekell reported in the 1790 Census in Taunton (1 male over 16 and 1 female),²² and a Moses Seakings who died at Taunton on 6 May 1803, one of the "towns poor."²³ These could be the same person.

Any of these five men could be a son of either Moses (m. 1717) or

Aaron (m. 1724/5). I have not been able to make a connection. The Seekins Genealogy places Aaron and Robert as children of the first Aaron. By default I could place Silas, Joshua and Moses as *possibly* the children of the first Moses.

Others, without marriage records, who probably belong to this generation:

Abiathar Seekell, born at Taunton on 28 November 1762, died 24 September 1835; in Canterbury, Windham County, Connecticut in the 1800 Census, Seneca County, New York in 1820 and 1830 censuses and buried there.³⁹

Caleb Sekel, in Dartmouth in the 1800 Census, age between 26 and 44 (therefore born between 1755 and 1775) (1 male and 1 female between 26 and 44, 2 females under 10).⁴⁰

Martin Seekins in Thetford, Orange County, Vermont, in the 1790 Census, Strafford, Orange County, in the 1800 Census (1 male and 1 female between 26 and 44, 1 female 16-25, 1 female 10-15, 3 males and 3 females under 10).⁴¹

Paul Seekins, died at Barton, Orleans County, Vermont, on 1810.42

The Seekins genealogy lists Aaron, Mary, Caleb, Lydia, Martin and Paul as children of Aaron and Hannah Seekins; and Mercy, James, Thankful and Elizabeth as children of Robert and Abigail Seekins.

Of the males of this generation who could have carried on the Seekell/Seekins surname:

Aaron moved to Maine by way of Vermont

John resided in Taunton and had children

Moses resided in Taunton and had children

James resided in Taunton in the 1800 Census, no children at home at that time.

Job resided in Taunton and had children

Silas, Jr., reported in Ashfield, Hampshire County, in the 1810 Census, which reported children in the household

Abiathar settled in Seneca County, New York, and had children

Caleb resided in Dartmouth at the time of the 1800 Census, with 2 children in the household

Martin lived in Vermont and had children

Paul lived in Vermont and had a child.

Our William Seekell could be a child or grandchild of one of the nine Seekell/ Seekins men of this generation known to have children.

AARON SEEKINS

AARON³ **SEEKINS** (*Aaron*²⁻¹) was born about 1750, a child of Aaron Seekins and Hannah Westcoat, and died before 1840 at Swanville, Waldo County, Maine. He married, after they published their intentions to marry at Plymouth on 3 May 1771 **TABITHA RAYMOND**, born on 1771, and died

Sekins.

before 1830 at Swanville.43

Aaron Seekins grew up in Middleboro. He migrated to Strafford where he was reported in the 1790 Census, then to Sharon, Windsor County, Vermont, where he was reported in the 1800 Census. In the 1820 and 1830 censuses they lived at Swanville.⁴⁴

JOB SEEKELL

JOB SEEKELL was born at Taunton on 29 October 1766, and died there on 26 December 1821. He married at Freetown on 9 February 1786 HEPZIBAH CLARK born at Freetown on 7 December 1769, a child of Theophilus Clark, and died at Taunton on 30 October 1859.⁶⁶

Job Seekell appeared in Taunton in the 1790, 1800, and 1820 censuses. An entry in the 1810 Census in Wareham, Plymouth County, could also be this Job Seekell. These early censuses list the head of household, and the composition of the family with the numbers in age and sex categories. The following tables list the categories in the census, with possible identification from what we know of the family:

We must keep in mind that the persons in a household are not necessarily all family members, and some family members may be in another household. Also, census takers sometimes make mistakes. The above information suggests that an older couple was living with Job and Hepzibah in 1800. Perhaps her parents or his parents? The female of this couple was still with them in 1810. Somehow, the children's presence is not indicated in 1810! In 1820 Hepzibah's age was underestimated by the census taker (or else a different woman was present). Although possible, it is unlikely that a woman of 50 would have three children under 10. Although Hepzibah lived for thirty-eight years after her husband's death, I cannot identify her in the census records until 1850, when she was living with her son William.

SILAS SEEKELL, JR.

SILAS SEEKELL, JR. (perhaps Silas², Moses¹) married at Berkley on 22 February 1787 JERUSHA BRIGGS. He died at Franklin County, Massachusetts, after 25 September 1819 (will) and before 29 March 1820 (will filed).⁷⁸

Silas Seekell was reported in Taunton in the 1790 and 1800 censuses, but in Ashfield in 1810. The 1790 census reported a male over 16, and three females. The 1800 Census reported a male over 45, a female 26-44, and five female children, one over 10 and four under 10. The 1810 Census reported a male and female over 45, two females between 16 and 25, two females between 10 and 15, and a boy and a girl under 10.⁷⁹ His will, written in 1819, named his wife and five daughters,

ABIATHAR SEEKELL

ABIATHAR SEEKELL was born at Taunton on 28 November 1762, and died at Tyre, Seneca County, New York, on 24 September 1835. He married **MARTHA MARY PARKE** who was born on 6 May 1883, and died at Tyre on 6 January 1835.⁸²

One on-line genealogy state that Abiathar and Martha were married at Rutland, Vermont ,on 1798, but I have not found any documentation to support this claim.

Abiathar Seekell fought in the Revolutionary War. Massachusetts records report his service as follows:⁸³

Seekell, Abiathar, Taunton. Private, Capt. Jacob Haskin's co., Col. John Jacob's regt.; enlisted June 22, 1778; service 5 mos. 18 days at Rhode Island; enlistment to expire Jan. 1, 1779; roll dated Tiverton

Capt. Jacob Haskin's (Light Infantry) co., entered service Oct. 5, 1779; discharged Jan 31, 1780; service 3 mos. 28 days; co. raised to join Col. John Jacob's regt. and serve until April 1, 1780, unless discharged sooner, but formed into a separate corps for above service.

That source shared almost identical information under the name Abiathar Seckins, indicating he was known by both names. However most of Abiathar's service was in units of the Rhode Island state troops. In his pension application, made in 1832, he made the following declaration:⁸⁴

Declaration

In order to obtain benefit of the Act of Congress of the seventh of June 1832

State of New York, Seneca County

also

Abiathar Sekel of the town of Seneca Falls in the said county of Seneca and state of New York aged seventy years personally appeared before the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Seneca this sixth day of October in the year 1832 who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to gain the benefit of the pension made by the Act of Congress passed the 7th day of June 1832. that he enlisted in the Army of the United States in the year 1777 in the month of March as he believes with Lieutenant Gabriel Allen, in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Stanton, in the Rhode Island state troops. The corps was called fifteen months [?] but about three months of their time had expired when he enlisted. He continued to serve in said troops for a few days more than one year when he was discharged on the

sixteenth day of March. Soon after he enlisted the company was commanded by Captain Tappin. He enlisted at Howland's Ferry in the state of Rhode Island where he and the company to which he was attached continued to remain until he was discharged. He [?] when he enlisted in the town of Taunton in the county of Bristol in the state of Massachusetts, when the time of his enlistment closed he was dismissed and written discharges were given, and he has no documentary evidence. He was engaged in no battle being only doing Garrison duty. The place called Howland's Ferry is opposite Newport in Rhode Island. In the year 1778 about the first of June he again enlisted in the nine months service in the Rhode Island state troops in the company commanded by Captain Haskins whose Christrian name he has now forgotten. He was stationed at Slade's Ferry across Taunton River. For some time the Corps of Captain Haskins joined General Sullivan's Army in the attempt to capture Newport. When he arrived at Howland's Ferry he was annexed to [?] Brigade. He was with this Brigade but a short time and does not recollect his Captain's name. When the siege of Newport was raised he was marched to Little Compton where he remained until the fore part of winter when he was discharged, having served seven months or thereabouts. He believes that he served some more than seven months but cannot be perfectly sure of the precise time. Afterwards the same Captain Hoskins raised a company of volunteers in which, he said he belonged, for three months to go and protect the town of Providence in the said state of Rhode Island where he remained three months. There was stationed at that place at that time four companies of troops, but he does not recollect who commanded the whole. He cannot recollect what year this was.

Afterwards he again volunteered under the same Captain Hoskins for six months, he cannot now recollect the year, bur he well remembers that he went soon after he was mustered on to Rhode island, and took possession of Newport when it was evacuated by the British troops and he remained there on Garrison duty until the spring following, when on the expiration of the said six months for which he was enlisted he was again

honorably discharged. He cannot recollect who commanded the port.

Declarant says that he was born in the town of Taunton in the county of Bristol and in the state of Massachusetts in the year one thousand seven hundred and sixty-two, that he does not to his knowledge have any record of his age; that he lived at each time he was called as above stated in the town of Taunton in the county of Bristol in the state of Massachusetts and that he has since lived in the state of Connecticut for about fifteen years since which he has lived in Seneca County aforesaid. He kindly relinquishes [?] claims whatever to a pension or annuity except this present and the laws his making is not on the pension role of the Agency of any state.

I apologize for any misreading of the penmanship, and for words I could not decipher, which are marked with [?]. Abiathar was struggling with his memory. During most of the Revolutionary War, the British occupied the port city of Newport. Abiathar was part of forces stationed around Newport, to prevent the British from breaking out. He served for most of the time from 1777 to early 1780.

According to the above declaration, Abiathar lived in Connecticut for fifteen years before moving to New York. However, census records after 1850 indicated the state or country of birth of each person; his first child, born in 1795, gave his birthplace as Connecticut; the second child, born about 1797-8 reported his birthplace as Vermont; the third child, born about 1799-1800, gave his birthplace as Vermont in the census, but was reported born in Connecticut in the census mortality schedule. Perhaps Abiathar lived in Vermont for a brief period about 1799 but did not consider it a significant enough stay to mention it in his pension declaration. I have not found Abiathar in the 1790 or 1810 censuses. In the 1800 Census he was reported at Canterbury. The family consisted of a male 26-44 (Abiathar was 37), a female 16-25 (Martha was 27), and three males under 10 (Horace was 4, Julius about 2, and Simeon newborn).⁸⁵

Three persons were engaged in agriculture. Their son Wheaton, who would have been 8, is not noted. Perhaps Wheaton was not a child of Abiathar. I have listed him as a possible child because he appeared next to Simeon in the 1850 Census.

By the 1830 Census, most of the children had married. Sons Horace and Julius were reported in nearby Tyre, son Abiathar in Seneca Falls, Seneca County. The elder Abiathar was also reported at Seneca Falls; his family consisted of a male 60-69 (Abiathar, 67), a female 50-59 (Martha, 57), a female 20-29 (Lucy, 30), a male 10-14 (unidentified) and a male 5-9 (unidentified).⁸⁷

CALEB SEEKELL

CALEB SEEKELL (*Aaron*²⁻¹) was born between 1755 and 1775; he married **JANE CLAGHORN**, who was born about 1762-3 and died at Little Compton, Newport County, on 20 March 1844.⁹⁴

Caleb Seekell may have been born at Middleboro, where his father owned property in 1755. He appears in the 1800 Census in Dartmouth with a household of a man and a woman between 26 and 44, and two girls under ten. ⁹⁵ Perhaps, Lavina, who was probably twelve, was miscounted as under ten. I cannot identify the other daughter.

Jane Seekell appeared in the 1840 Census in Dartmouth, with no indication of family members.⁹⁶

Caleb and Jane Seekell had the following child, and probably at least one other daughter.

MARTIN SEEKINS

MARTIN SEEKINS (Aaron²⁻¹) was born before 1765. He married about 1783 **GEDIDA** .⁹⁸

Martin Seekins, of Dartmouth, served in the Revolutionary War. His record follows:⁹⁹

Seekin, Martin. Descriptive list of men raised to reinforce the Continental Army for the term of 6 months, agreeable to resolve of June 5, 1780, rerturned as received of Justin Ely, commissioner, by Brig. Gen. John Glover, at Springfield, July 13, 1780; age, 18 yrs.; stature 5 ft. 2 in.; complexion, dark; engaged for town of Dartmouth; marched to camp July 13, 1780, under command of Capt. Thomas Pritchard. Seekins, Martin, Dartmouth. List of men raised for the 6 months service and returned by Brig. Gen. Paterson as having passed muster in a return dated Camp Totoway, Oct. 25, 1780.

Martin Seekins was reported at Thetford in the 1790 Census. The family consisted of two males over 16 and five females. He was in Strafford in 1800. At that time the household of ten consisted of a couples aged 26-44, a young woman between 16 and 25, a girl between 10 and 15,

and three boys and three girls under 10.¹⁰¹ The 1810 Census found this family at Hartford, Windsor County with ten persons, but a different composition: a man over 45, a woman between 26 and 44, three young adults, one male and two female, between 16 and 25, one boy and one girl between 10 and 15, and three girls under 10.¹⁰²

The Seekins genealogy adds more information: 103

In 1785, he and his wife, Gedida, and two daughters migrated to Orange Co., Vermont with his brother Aaron. . . . In 1793, he moved to Strafford where he was one of nine men who formed the first Free-will Baptist Church west of the Connecticut River in the green hills of Vermont. . . . About 1808, he and his nephew, John, first son of Aaron (3), with their families, migrated to Batavia, Genessee Co., New York. . . . When his youngest son, Joseph, moved to Ellington, Chautauqua, Co., N.Y. in 1827, he and his wife, presumably, moved there. They both died bef. 1830.

PAUL SEEKINS

PAUL SEEKINS was born at Dartmouth about 1759, and died at Barton on 1810.¹⁰⁵

The Seekins genealogy reported the following: 106

Paul may have been in Kennebec County, Maine in the 1790 census, but soon after he was a resident of Bennington, Vt.; was listed there in the 1800 census, having a son 10 to 15 years of age and five daughters (not of record). About 1803 4, he moved to Barton, Vt., where he was on the tax list in 1804. Both he and his wife died there in 1810.

Paul Seekins had the following child, perhaps others: 107

So, from which line of the Seekell/Seekins family could our William Seekell have come?

The two censuses in which his name and age appear, place his birth about 1809-10 at Massachusetts. A son's death record places his birth in Middleboro. This should not be taken too seriously. Middleboro and Taunton were adjoining towns with a long border. Many Seekell records

point to the eastern part of Taunton, near Middleboro. Several Seekells of Taunton owned land in Middleboro. Also, this area is not far from the Berkley town line.

Let's look at these family lines:

Aaron Seekins. Aaron and most of his children moved to northern New England. The one exception, Ezekiel Seekins, returned from Vermont to Plymouth. Ezekiel had two sons born about the time of William's birth: Harvey, whose death record identifies his parents and age; and Hermon, whose marriage record identifies his parents and whose death record indicates his age. With one son born about 1808-9 and another 1809-10, it is unlikely that William could have also been born to this family.

John Seekell had one known son, John, who had a daughter born 20 November 1809 and a son born 23 May 1811. The Taunton vital records appear thorough with regard to this family. There appears little room for the birth of William here.

Moses Seekell had three sons old enough to be William's father. First son James remained single according to his death record. Third son John did not marry until 1816. Second son Joshua had a son William born at Freetown on 30 March 1809. This William is well documented marrying Mary Ann Pierce at New Bedford on 13 November 1839. The family was reported at Taunton in census records for 1840, 1850, 1855, 1860, and 1870, and in Michigan in 1880. This is not our William.

Job Seekell had six children whose births were recorded at Taunton, the last, Apollos, being born on 7 June 1798. I have placed a seventh child, George, in this family, born about 1812-3, because he appeared with Apollos in the 1850 Census. According to the 1820 Census, this family had 3 boys under 10. If these boys were children of Job and Hepzibah, it is possible that our William, age 10, could be one of these boys. Hepzibah would have been 43 years old when George was born.

<u>Silas Seekell, Jr.</u> moved to the Connecticut Valley section of Massachusetts. The names of his children are known from his will. There is no William.

Abiathar Seekell lived in Connecticut in 1800 and soon after moved to New York state. It is unlikely that he could have had a child born in Massachusetts about 1809-10.

<u>Caleb Seekell</u> left very little record. He was living in Dartmouth in 1800; his widow was reported there in 1840. She would have been 46 years old in 1809. It is possible that William could have come from this family, but unlikely.

Martin Seekins and his sons were soon far away from Massachusetts.

Paul Seekins and his known son were also soon far from Massachusetts.

Conclusion. There is no proof of anything. The least unlikely family of origin of William W. Seekell was the family of Job and Hepzibah (Clark) Seekell. However, there could be other lines I have not found.

THE FAMILY OF WILLIAM SEEKELL AND DELANY PITTSLEY

WILLIAM W. SEEKELL was born at Middleboro about 1809-10, and died sometime between 1855 and 1865. He married at Freetown on 29 June 1829. **DELANY PITTSLEY**, who was born at Freetown on 13 May 1805, a child of Elijah and Rebecca Pittsley. She died at Freetown on 29 November 1888.¹⁰⁸
